IIM -R organises discussion on innovation in health

Raipur: The Indian Institute of Management Raipur (IIM Raipur), in association with Stanford's Biodesign, conducted a round table discussion on innovation in health for Chhattisgarh.

discussed the problem faced by patients who have to travel to major cities for treatmen. The group recognized the necessity of reducing the burden on tertiary hospitals like AIIMS in cities by providing treatment in local towns or cities or via telemedicine.

The group discussed the challenges in the field of healthcare, one of the major challenges being the shortage of human resources in remote areas. The group concluded that technology could bridge this gap. They noted that existing govt policies such as the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) could be leveraged for healthcare innovation. The group agreed to reconvene for further deliberations in July 2024.
