

Modern techniques of good governance discussed

ON THE second day of the Chintan Shivir 2.0 organised at the Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Raipur extensive discussions on innovations to deliver central and state government schemes to the public and modern techniques of good governance were discussed.

Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai and his cabinet colleagues shared their thoughts on various aspects of good governance with subject matter experts.

On the concluding day of the 'Chintan Shivir,' Sanjeev Sanyal, a member of the Prime Minister's Economic Advisory Council, delivered a lecture on the 'Art of Good Governance.'

He highlighted important topics such as simplifying administrative processes, increasing state capacities, removing unnecessary regulations, and restructuring government agencies. He explained how governments can improve the quality of their policy-making and implementation.

Digital health expert Dr. Rajendra Prasad Gupta spoke on "Digital Health Technologies and Good Governance," stating that digital health technologies are capable of providing quality services even in remote and back-

ward areas.

He suggested measures to enhance transparency and accountability in healthcare services through technologies like e-health records, telemedicine, mobile health apps, and artificial intelligence. He emphasized that digital health technology not only empowers health services but also increases public trust in governance.

Political analyst and author Uday Mahurkar discussed "Good Governance to Election," elaborating on the historical perspective of Indian democracy, the quality of political conduct,

administrative accountability, and the pro-people implementation of policies. He explained that a strong and transparent governance system increases public trust in democracy and also influences the electoral process.

He also highlighted measures to strengthen good governance at the local level, bring transparency to elections, and establish ethical values in administration.

Chief Minister's Secretary Rahul Bhagat and Director of IIM Raipur, Ram Kakani, were also present on the occasion.
